


What is Legal Aid?



Why Medical-Legal Partnership?



70% of health determined by Social Determinants of Health

74% of low-income households (<125% FPL) experienced
<u>at least</u> 1 civil legal problem in the last year



What is a Medical-Legal Partnership?

An upstream approach to health care in which a lawyer is added to the health care team to address patients' social determinants of health through legal intervention.







Coordinated Entry Review, Robin Daily

Coordinated Entry System (CES)

A community-wide process that streamlines access to housing using data-driven methods to serve people with the most appropriate intervention in the right order.

Coordinated Entry System Big Picture

Community **Access Points Referral to Housing** Common By Name List 211 Intervention **Prioritized by Acuity** Assessment High Acuity (8-17) Shelter Mid Acuity (5-7) HUB Low Acuity (0-4) Outreach **Divert** Navigation **Options outside CES** Intake Assigned **VI-SPDAT** RRH based on **Drop In** acuity and PSH program availability



Each year, advocates in every community across the nation conduct a Point-In-Time Count to estimate the number of people experiencing homelessness.

The Homeless Services Network of Central Florida and local agencies rely on a volunteer foot patrol covering the region to count and conduct brief interviews with willing participants. Volunteers will receive training and have supervision. This census is required by the federal government to determine funding for each community, and it helps us adjust our region's efforts to provide housing and services for our most vulnerable residents.

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
